

Fees & Funding 2019

The National Centre for Circus Arts is an affiliate School of the Conservatoire for Dance and Drama. Established in 2001, the Conservatoire is a publicly-funded higher education institution composed of eight affiliate schools. All of these are small, specialist institutions with international reputations for high quality delivery in their respective fields. Students of the National Centre are also registered students of the Conservatoire.

Bursaries and Scholarships

As part of the Conservatoire for Dance and Drama, the Centre can offer partial bursaries and scholarships to some students through the Government and our own schemes. For

To be considered for scholarships/bursaries your Student Finance application must be 'means tested' – meaning that either yours or your parents' income is assessed. You must ensure that you have provided consent to share this financial information with the school for eligibility purposes. Without this information we cannot determine your eligibility for scholarships or bursaries.

Second Degree Students

Applicants who have previously completed a level 6 higher education programme (e.g. BA, BSc or level 6 Diploma) are unlikely to be eligible for funding for a second degree.

Applicants who have completed part of a degree or another type of qualification such as an HND may be eligible for funding to cover part of the programme but not all. Any applicant in this situation who is offered a place on the degree programme must ensure that they are clear about how much funding they are eligible for, and how they will pay their tuition fees and living costs before accepting their place on the degree.

Scholarships may very occasionally be available for second degree students based on talent and need, but applicants should be aware that these will be partial fee waivers or cash bursaries between £100 and £4,000 - they will not be able to cover the full cost of tuition fees or living costs whilst on the programme. Any second degree student who wishes to be considered for such a scholarship must submit a means tested application for student finance so that family income can be assessed. You can apply for an income assessment from Student Finance England even if you are not eligible for a loan.

Self-Payer Information

Students who are not in receipt of a tuition fee loan are liable for their own fees. Annual fees can be paid in 3 instalments over the year - 50% to be paid two weeks prior to the start of the year, 25% at the start of the second term and 25% at the start of the third term.
